

# How to create an Apple ID



# Setting up a new Apple ID

When setting up any new Apple device - including iPhones, iPads, iPods and Mac computers - Apple will want you to set up an Apple ID.

An Apple ID is an account that lets you access Apple services. You can buy apps, back up photos, pay for things, buy music and secure your personal details.

## Getting started on a new device

1. Tap, **Set up as new**
2. Tap '**Forgot password or Apple ID**'.
3. Tap '**Create a free Apple ID**'.
4. Enter you **date of birth**.
5. Enter your **First name** and **last name**.
6. Tap **use your current email address**, or tap **Get a free iCloud email address**.



NOTE: You can use an existing email address if you have one.

## Buying an App

To download or buy apps from the App store, you will need to sign in using your Apple ID.

1. Tap the **App store icon** on your screen.
2. Browse or search for the app you want.
3. Tap the **App** you want.
4. Tap the **price**, or tap **get**.
5. A payment method will be required for apps with a price.



The app will start downloading on your Home screen. Once downloaded, you can open it and use it.

# Create an Apple ID in the App Store



1. Open the App store and tap your profile picture
2. Tap **Create new Apple ID**.
3. Enter your **email address and password**
4. Choose the **country or region** that matches your address.
5. Read and agree to the **Terms and Conditions** and **Apple Privacy Policy**. Then Tap '**Next**'.
6. Enter your **first name, last name** and **date of birth**.
7. Enter your **credit card** and **billing information**.

NOTE: You can choose none. You will not be charged until you make a purchase. You can change or remove payment details later.

8. Tap **next**.
9. Confirm your **phone number**.
10. Check your **email inbox for a verification email** from Apple, and follow the steps to verify the email address.

Congratulations! Your Apple ID is set up and you're ready to continue.
